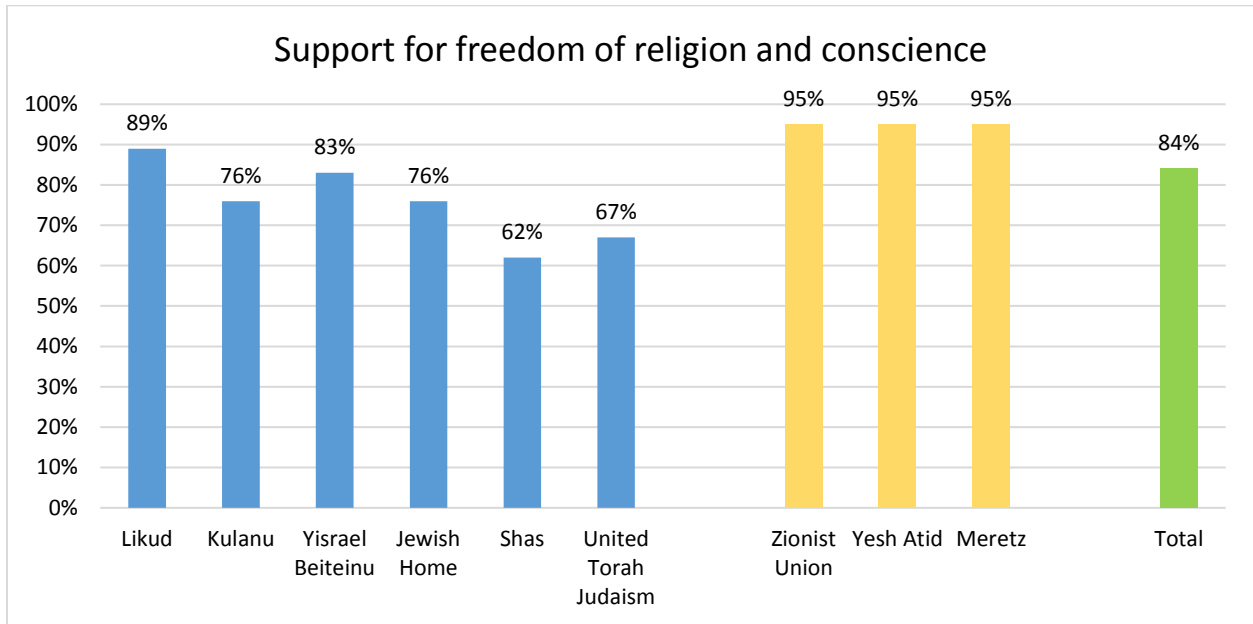
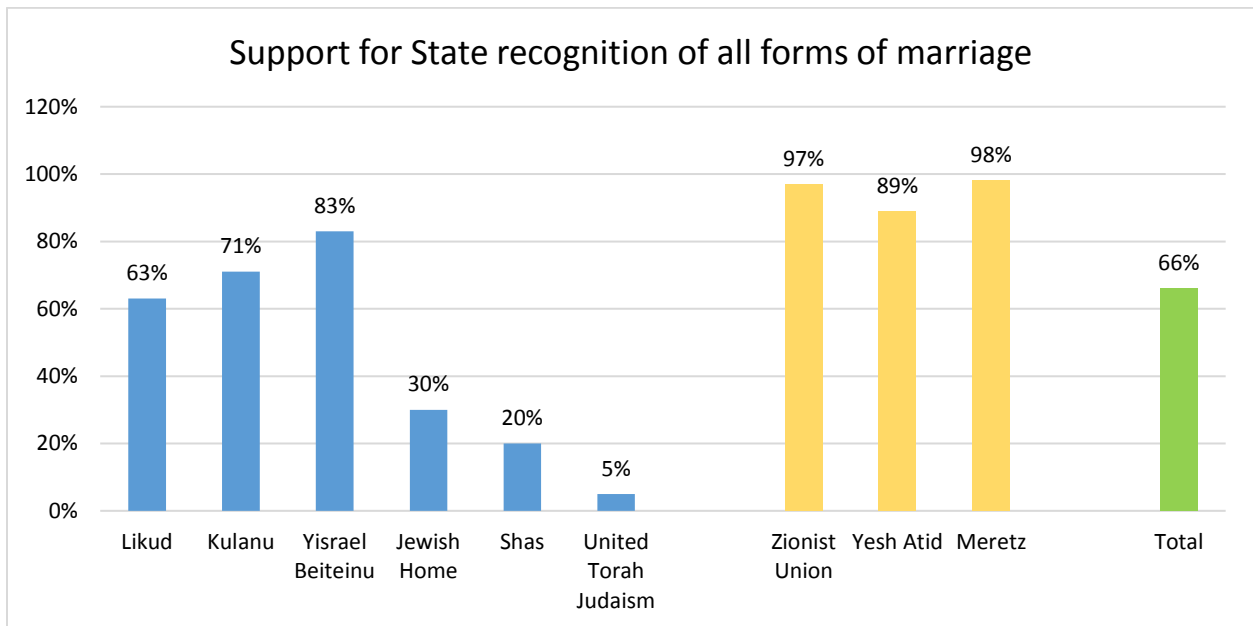


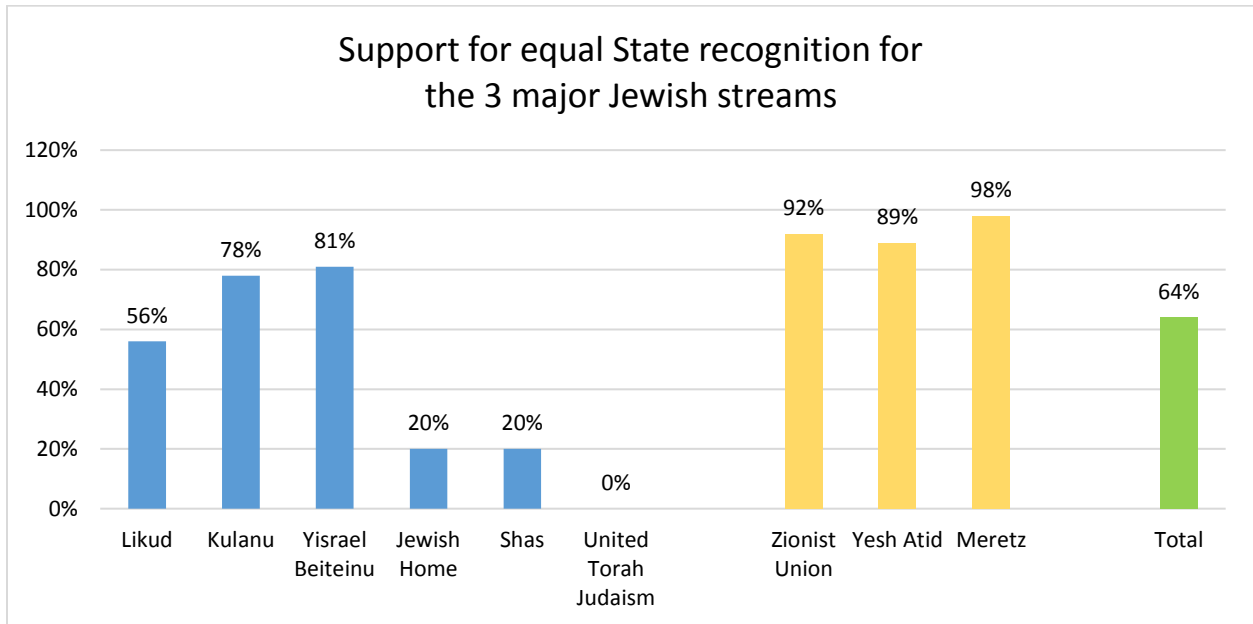
Do you support the State of Israel actualizing freedom of religion and conscience, meaning freedom of choice for secular and religious Israelis to act according to their personal worldviews?

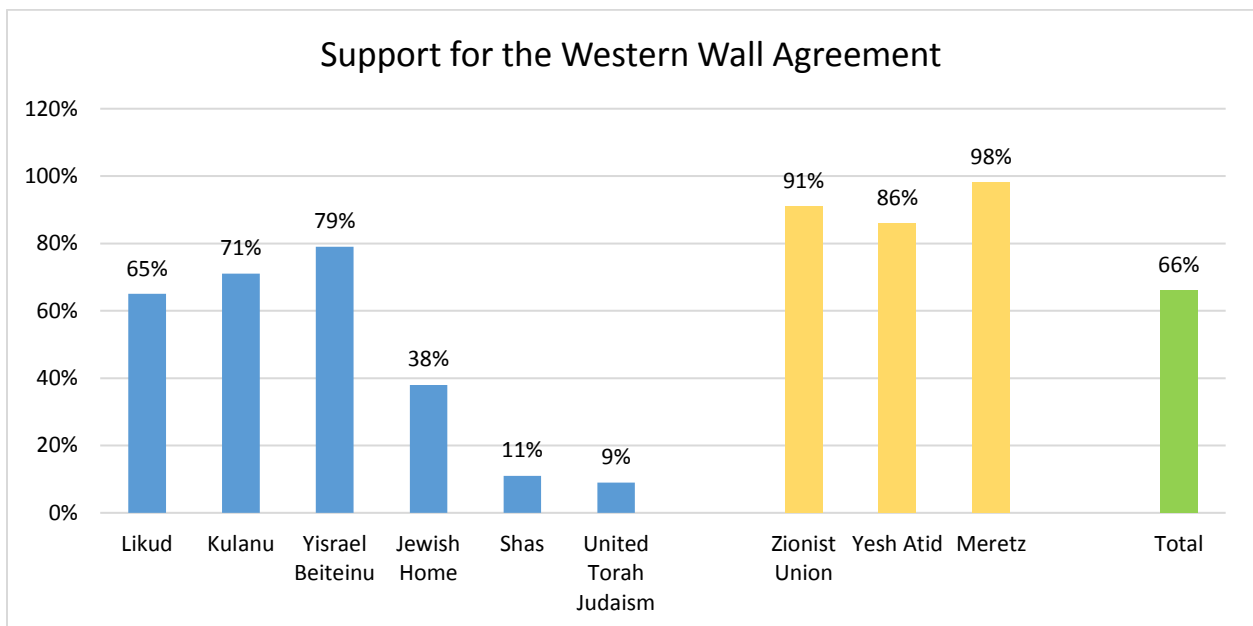


Do you agree or disagree that the State of Israel should grant equal status to the 3 major Jewish religious streams - Orthodox, Conservative, and Reform?

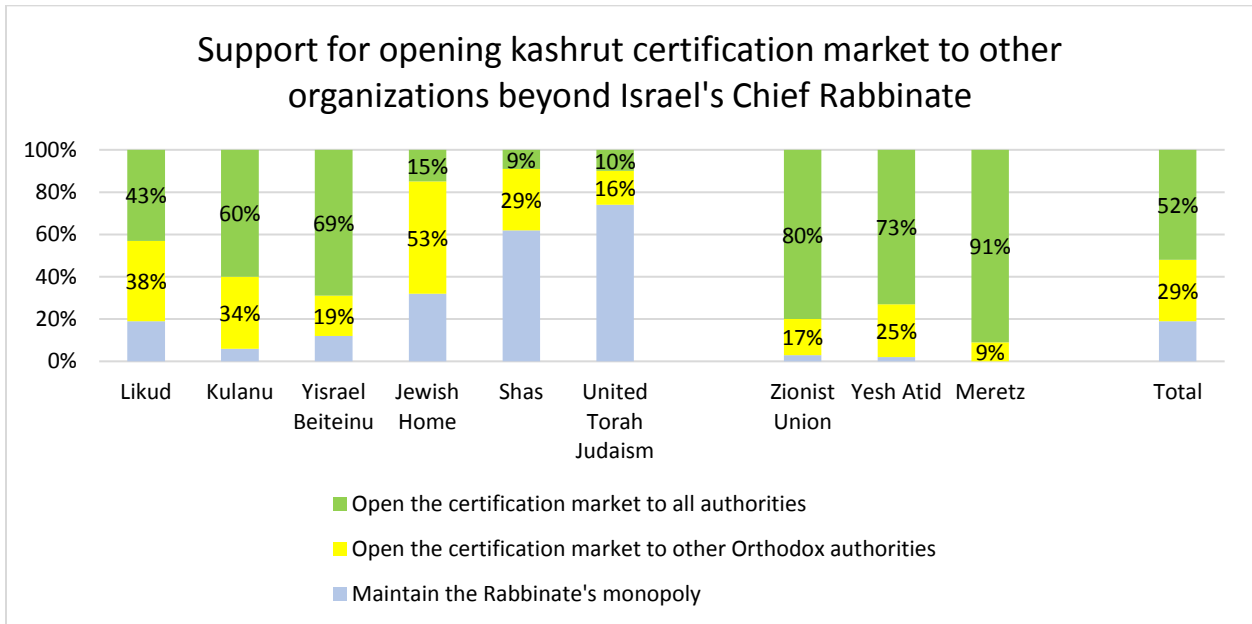

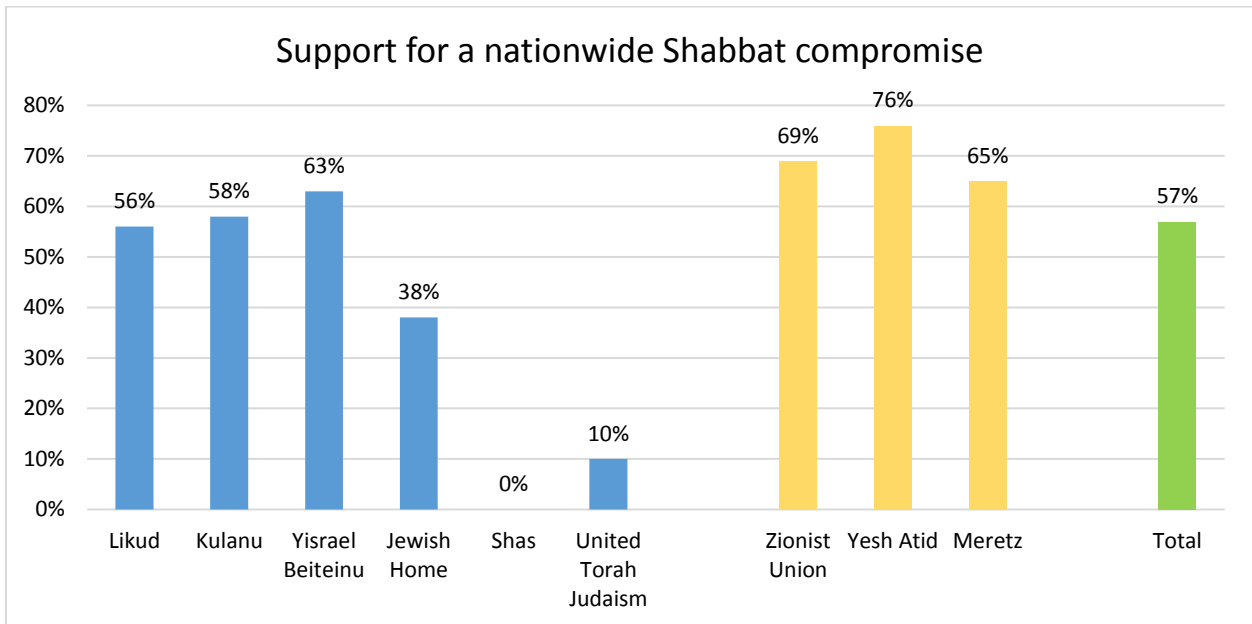
Do you support or oppose the Western Wall agreement?



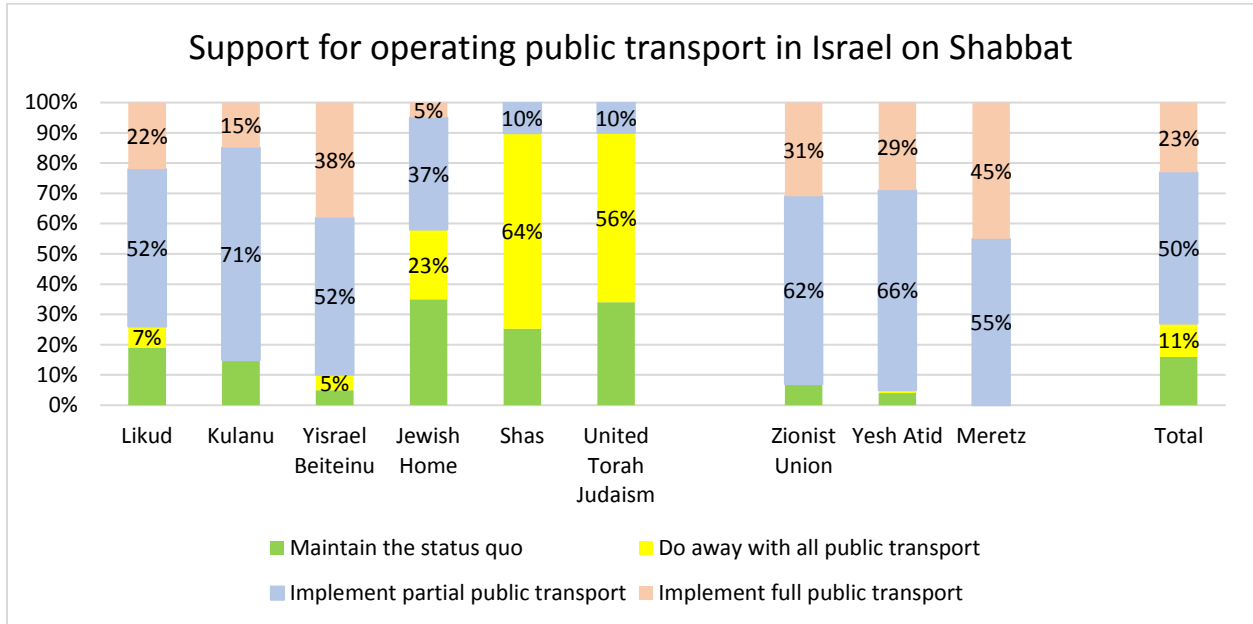

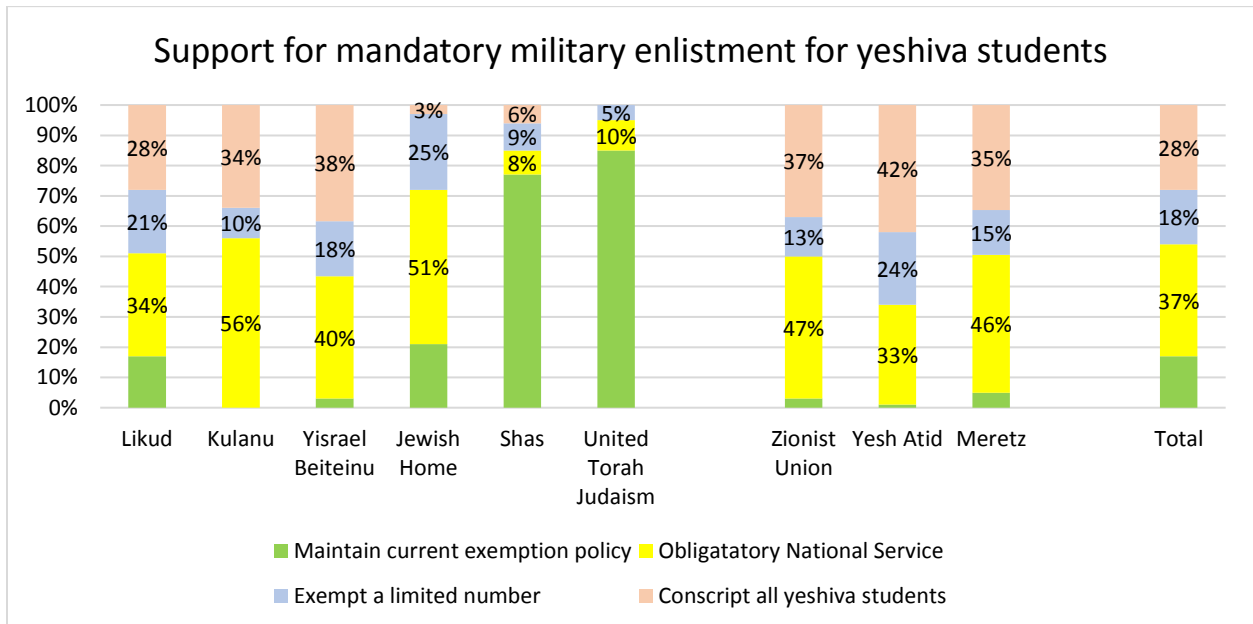

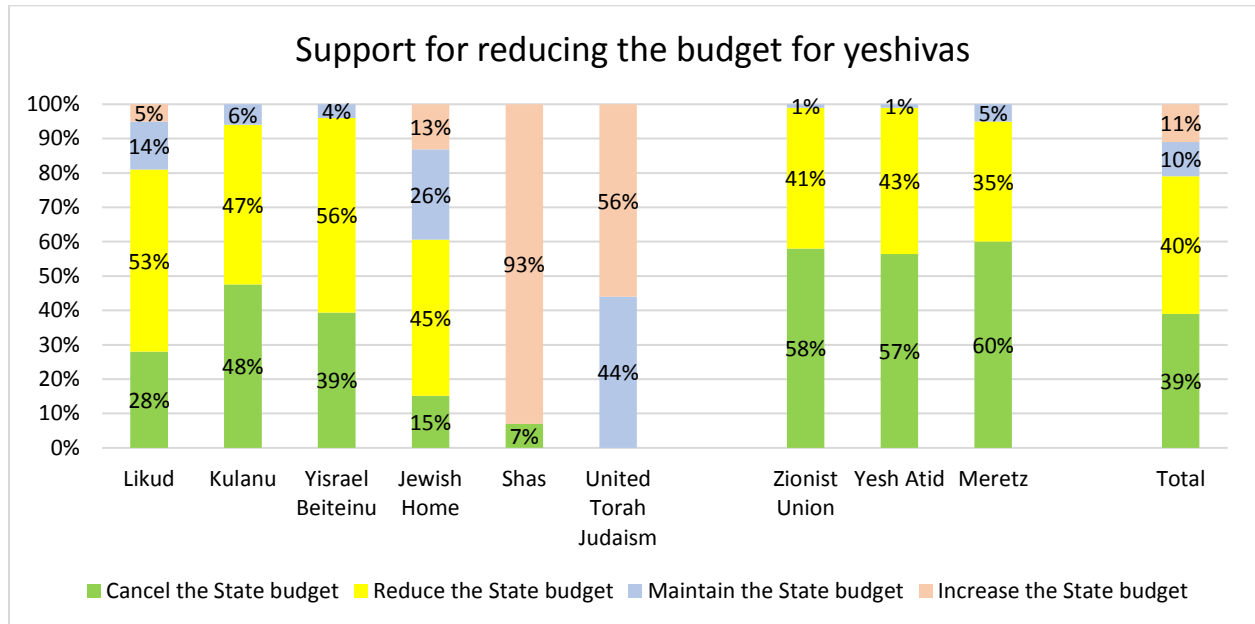
There exists an argument over the operation of public transport on Shabbat. What should the Government do in this regard?



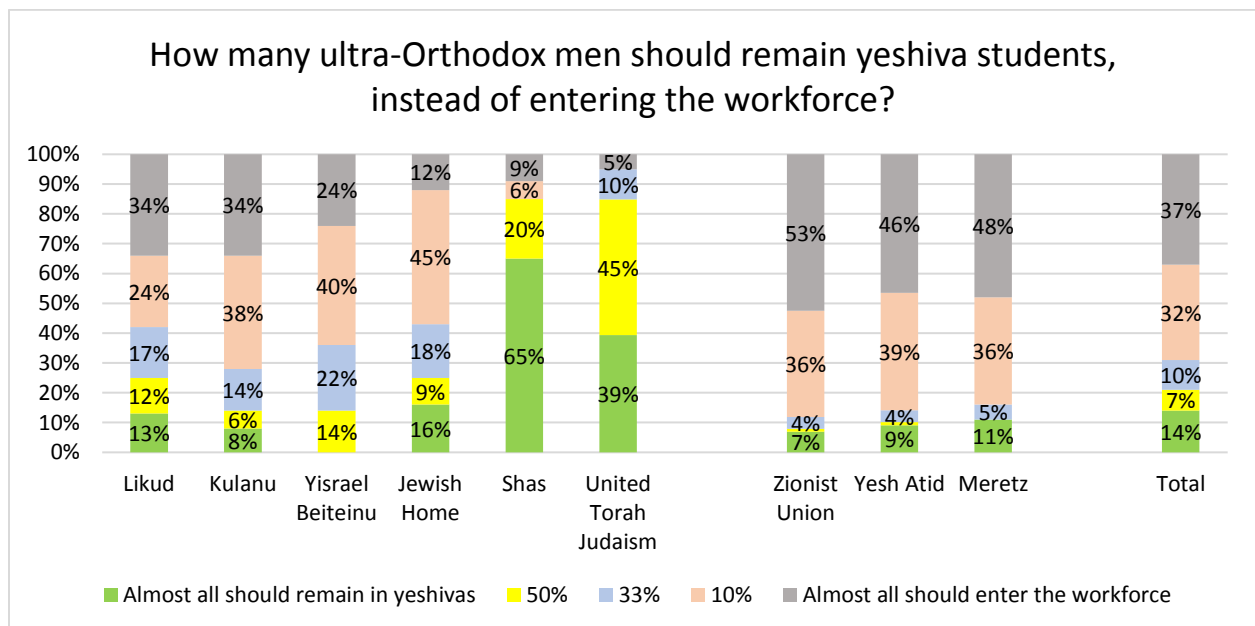
Approximately 15% of enlistment age people eligible for military service are studying in yeshivas, and most of them don't serve in the IDF. Which of the following reflects your view?



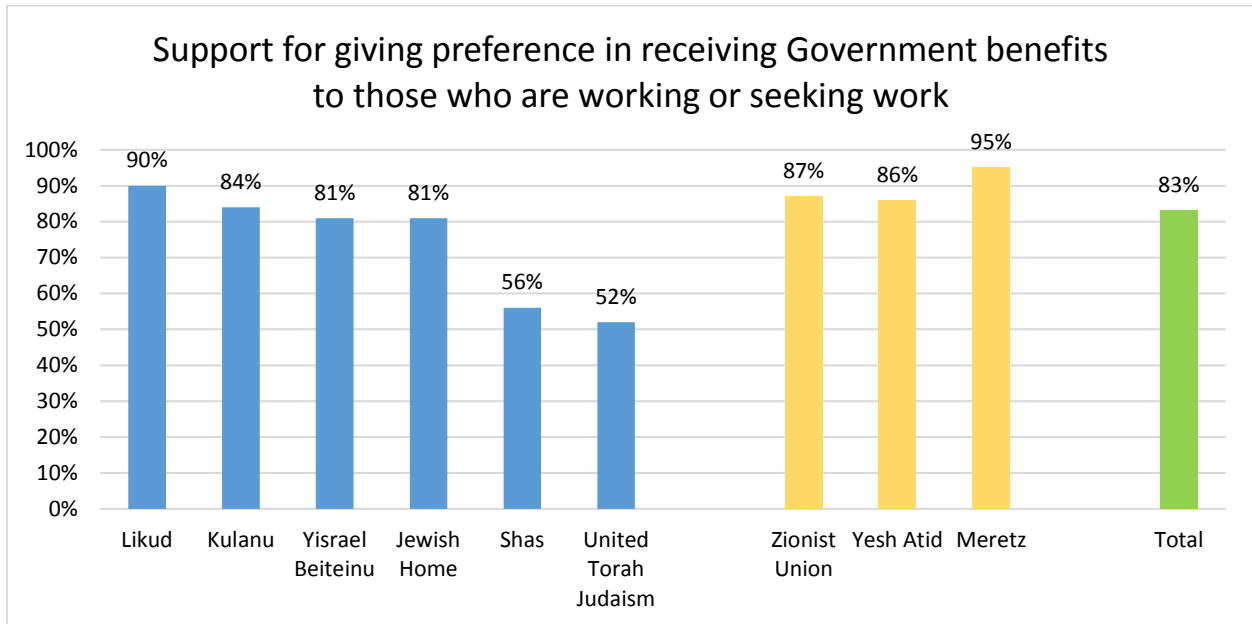

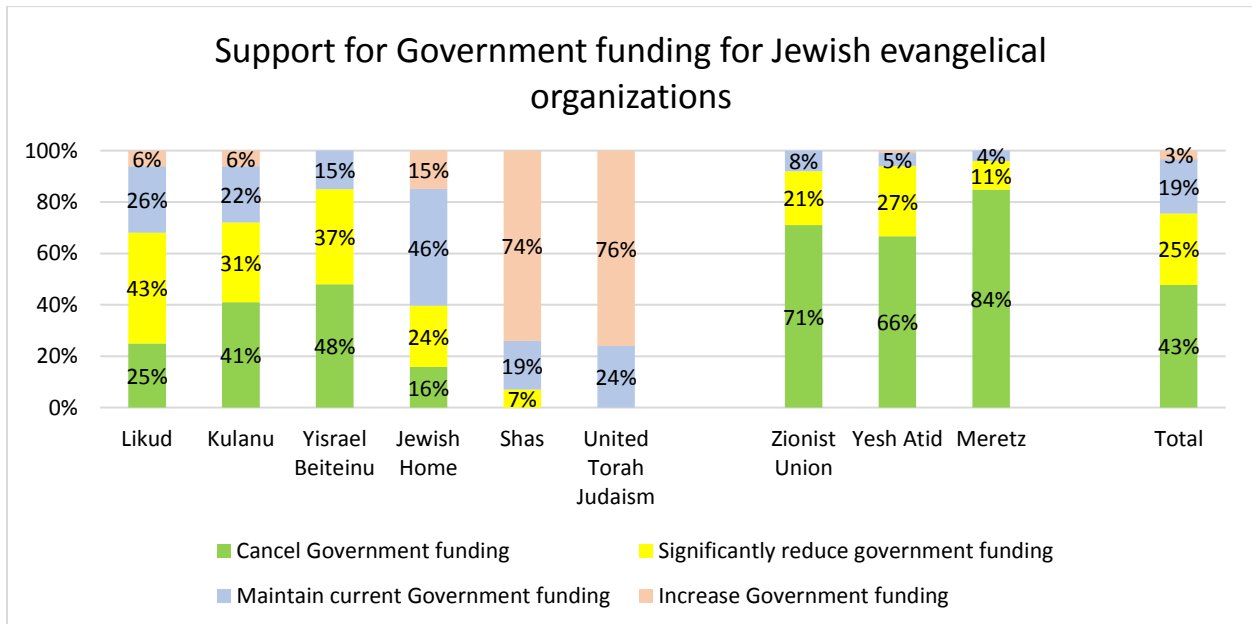

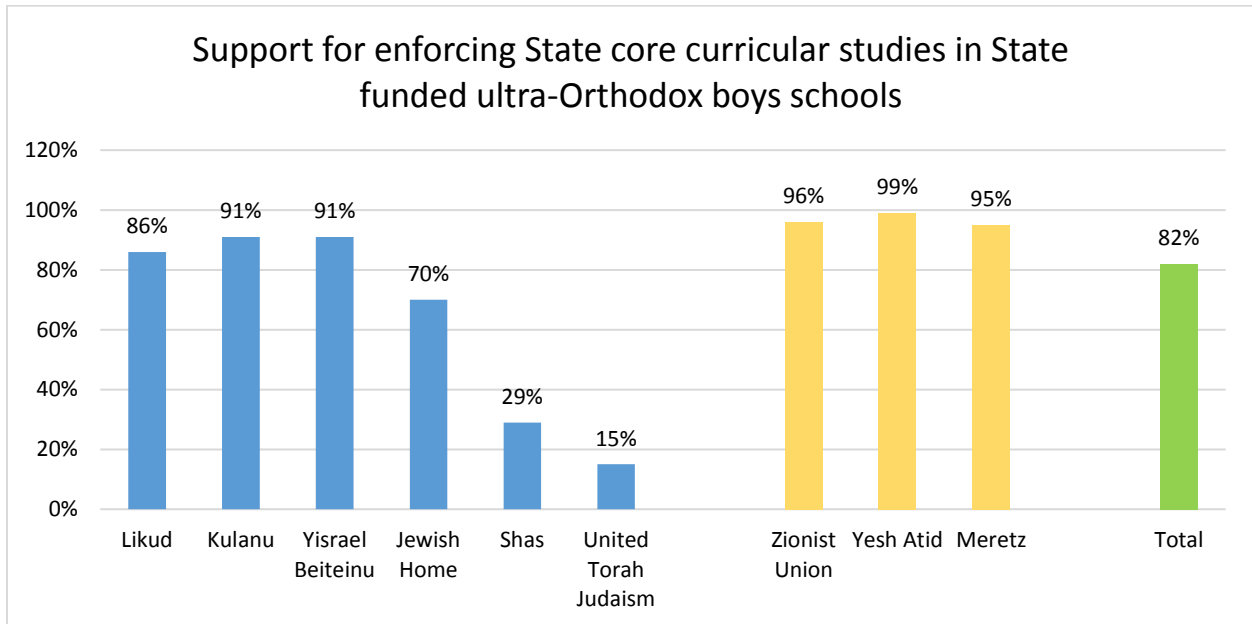

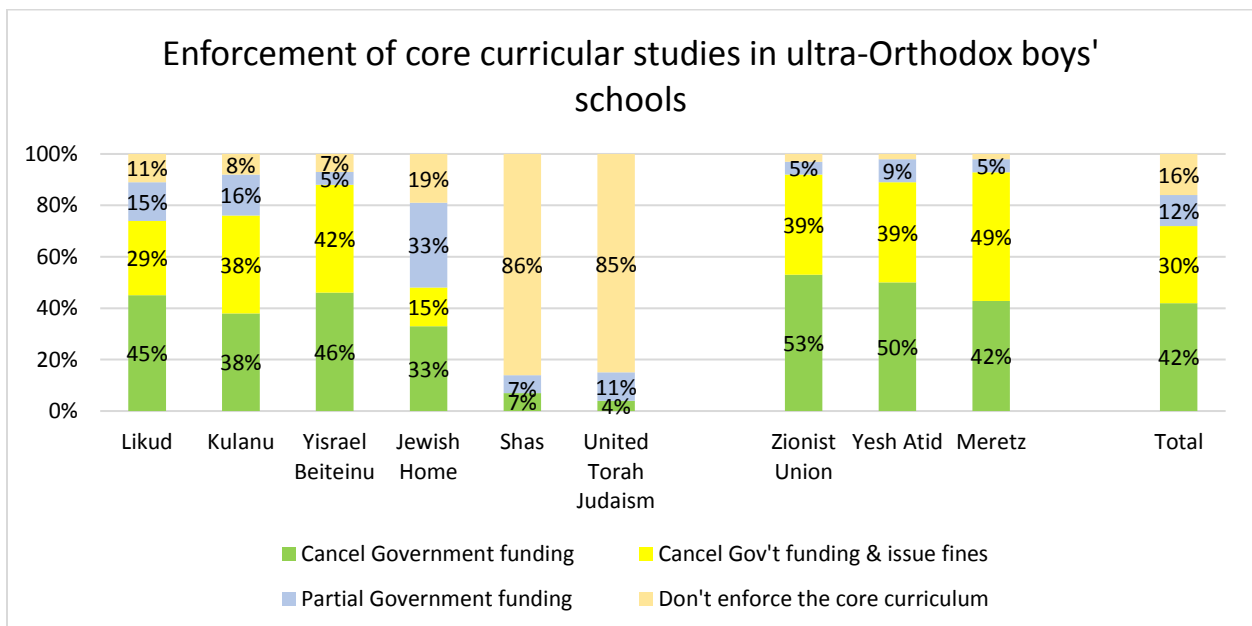
The State of Israel funds organizations that do Orthodox Jewish religious outreach through the education budget and culture budget. What is your view?



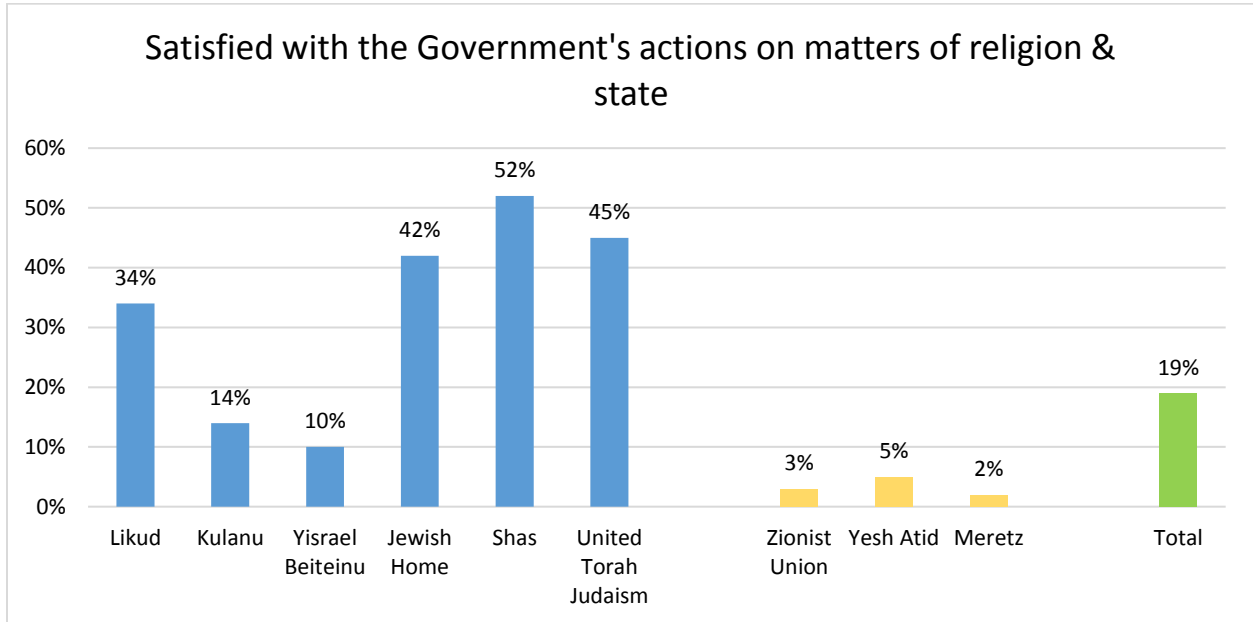
Do you think State funded ultra-Orthodox schools should be obligated to implement the State's core curriculum, which includes mathematics, English, sciences, and civics?



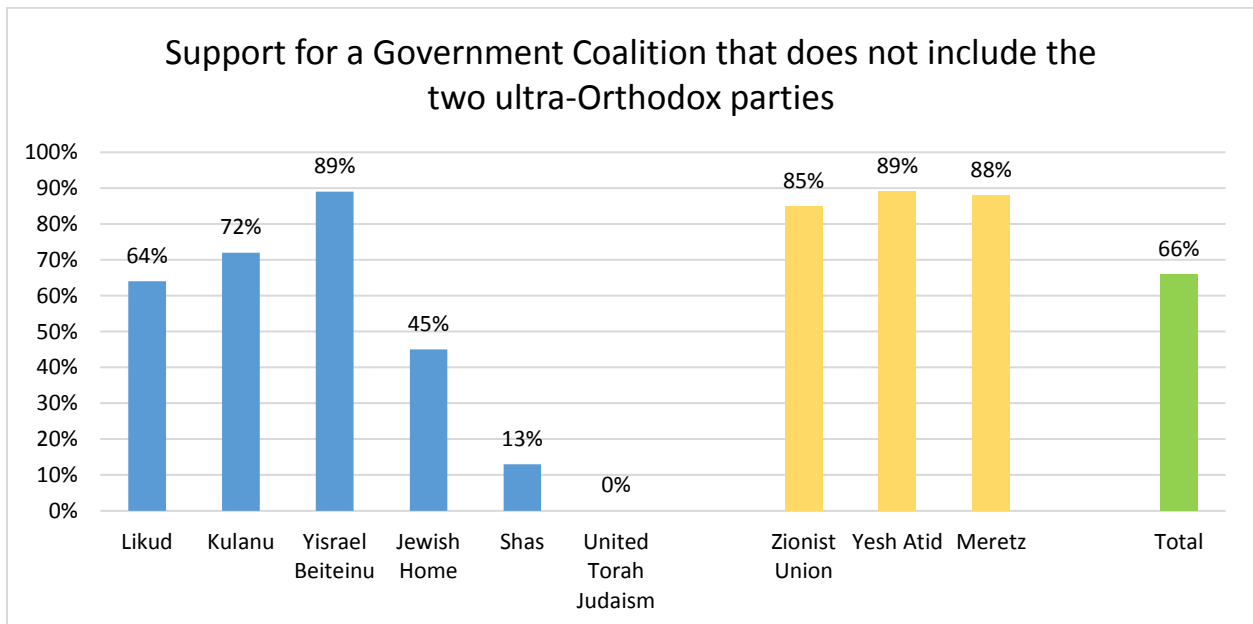
How do you think the implementation of State core curricular studies should be enforced in ultra-Orthodox schools?
